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Normal Sights During Foaling And Sights That Represent Abnormal Positions

Normal Parturition

- 1. Whitish membrane (amnion, inner placental membranes) appears and breaks
- 2. Bluish-white, foal containing sac appears
- 3. One hoof appears with sole surface pointed downward toward the mare's legs
- 4. A second hoof appears 3 to 4 inches behind the other in the same orientation
- 5. The fore legs appear both extending equal distances with each contraction
- 6. The nose appears cradled on top of the legs
- 7. The head appears
- 8. The shoulders appear one by one
- 9. The rib cage and abdomen appear the mare may briefly rest at this stage
- 10. The hips appear the mare may rest with the hind legs still in the birth canal

Sights of Abnormal Presentations

- 1. Mare stops delivery after second stage has started
- 2. Foal is not progressing out of the birth canal
- 3. Mare becomes tired, exhausted, weak, or unstable
- 4. Red bag delivery premature placental separation
